The Mahaska County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on the above date at 9:00 a.m. in the third floor conference room of the Mahaska County courthouse. Present were the following board members: Chairman – Mark Doland; Vice chairman – Henry VanWeelden; Member – Mark Groenendyk. Chairman Doland opened the meeting at 9:00 a.m. with a moment of silence.

It was moved by Groenendyk seconded by VanWeelden to approve agenda. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Public Comments: Steve Wanders – requested audio tape and sign in sheet from EMA meeting held on August 30th. Board directed Mr. Wanders to request from the EMA Commission.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Groenendyk to approve minutes from September 15th meeting. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Based on county attorney direction Supervisor Groenendyk noted that the board should take no action on Item #4 on agenda: Consider removal of Mahaska

County from Ehler RFP and financial obligation therein. The EMA will take action at their September 21 meeting.

Dave Sedivec, Conservation Dir., gave monthly report and it was placed on file.

Deann DeGroot, MCARD, gave monthly report and it was placed on file.

It was moved by Groenendyk seconded by VanWeelden to remove due to resignation, Sheriff's Deputy Trevor Wells, from sheriff's department payroll effective September 22, 2017 as recommended by sheriff. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

It was moved by Groenendyk seconded by VanWeelden to approve liquor license application for Your Private Bartender for a five day Class C liquor license permit effective October 3, 2017. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Sheriff VanRenterghem reported that City of Eddyville had contacted him about terminating the 28E agreement between them and Sheriff Dept. as the city is considering implementation of their own police department. Board consensus was not to terminate until agreement expires.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Groenendyk to authorize signature on FY17 Targeted Case Management Report as presented by Heather Gross, CDS. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Groenendyk to approve an office space floor plan for the Annex building which includes relocating Juvenile Services and Veteran's Affairs offices into the building. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Clarification was made on Coordinator of Disability Services job in relation to 28E with South Central Behavioral Health Region and county mental health funding. 28E is written in coordination with Iowa code. At present the position is paid from the county (mental health) services fund and a portion from county (mental health) services fund is sent to region. Supervisor Doland reported that the Region board is working toward total regionalization that would make the CDS position a regional employee. There would be one full time CDS employee in each county in the region.

Troy Bemis, Maintenance Director presented three quotes for design, technical documents, and bidding and construction services for work to be done on the Mahaska County Law Enforcement Center building: façade brick refacing and reroofing. Shive-Hattery; \$28,900, frk Architects; \$74,250; Midwest Construction Consultants; \$56,750. It was moved by Doland seconded by VanWeelden to pursue services with Shive-Hattery. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Engineer Shanahan asked the board for authority to post for a vacancy in the department. Consensus was given. Engineer discussed upcoming road projects, their timing and funding source.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT AVAILABILITY

Proposed U.S. 63 northwest Oskaloosa bypass and intent to acquire property in Mahaska County to be discussed in Oskaloosa on November 2, 2017

All interested persons are invited to attend a public hearing between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. Nov. 2, 2017, at the Oskaloosa High School Commons, 1816 N. Third St., in Oskaloosa. The purpose is to discuss the proposed U.S. 63 northwest bypass route around Oskaloosa, and gather public feedback on the environmental documentation, bypass route preferred alternative, and potential impacts pertaining to planned highway improvements. The environmental assessment is now available at the Oskaloosa Public Library, 301 S. Market St., and will be available for review during the public hearing.

The Iowa Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration has prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) for this project. A copy of the EA will be available for inspection at the meeting, and can also be found on the Iowa DOT website, and at the Oskaloosa Public Library, 301 S. Market St., in Oskaloosa. The open forum will be held from 6 to 7 p.m. The formal hearing will be held from 7 to 8 p.m., with a presentation starting at 7 p.m. Interested individuals are encouraged to attend the meeting. Oral and written statements will be accepted during both the open forum and the formal session.

During the open forum Iowa DOT staff

will be present to discuss the project. After the open forum a formal presentation will be displayed followed by a question-and-answer session. Persons wishing to make a formal statement will need to note that at the time of registration. There will be a three minute limit per speaker during the question-and-answer session.

Written statements and related exhibits, in place of or in addition to oral statements made at the meeting, will be accepted at the meeting or may be submitted to the Office of Location and Environment, Iowa DOT, 800 Lincoln Way, Ames, Iowa 50010 or via the public meetings website at www.iowadot.gov/pim or at <https://bit.ly/iowadot105661702>. NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

When the Iowa DOT is proposing to acquire property under the power of eminent domain for a public improvement project it is required to give notice of a public hearing to all owners and contract purchasers of record of agricultural land which may be subject to condemnation.

Proposed improvements: Notice is hereby given that the Iowa DOT will consider approving the project described above.

Private property may be acquired by purchase or condemnation: If the Iowa DOT approves the project described above, the Iowa DOT will be required to acquire property for the proposed improvement(s). The Iowa DOT will attempt to purchase the required property by good faith negotiations; however, it may condemn those properties it is unable to purchase through eminent domain. The proposed location of the public improvement(s) described above is shown on preliminary plans for the project. Preliminary plans are available from the Office of Location and Environment, Iowa DOT, 800 Lincoln Way, Ames, Iowa 50010.

Process to decide to fund the design, select the route or site location,

or acquire or condemn property interests: To acquire the necessary properties and property interests required for the project, the Iowa DOT is required to approve the project location. The Iowa DOT will hold a public hearing, to present the proposed improvement(s) and potential impact(s) as a result of the improvement(s). Persons, whose property may be affected by the project, as well as the general public, may comment on the project at the public hearing. Based in part on the information received at the hearing, the Iowa DOT will select the project location and determine whether to fund the site-specific design and to authorize by purchase or condemnation the acquisition of right of way for the project.

AMENDMENTS TO SOUTH IOWA AREA CRIME COMMISSION JOINT AGREEMENT

The Articles of Agreement for the Southeastern Iowa Area Crime Commission Service Agency were filed of record on or about February 12, 1973, with Amendments thereto filed with the Iowa Secretary of State on November 15, 1983. Said Agreement is amended further as follows:

ARTICLE I – NAME

Section 1. Name. The official name of this organization shall be the South Iowa Area Crime Commission.

ARTICLE V – PURPOSE

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Agreement is to create an Area Crime Commission Service Agency for the

purpose of assisting governmental bodies within the area in developing plans, reviewing grant requests, making recommendations to the appropriate state agencies, providing fiscal accountability, assisting with law enforcement endeavors, providing training to law enforcement and correctional officers of member governmental agencies, assisting with the preparation of standard operating policies and procedures for law enforcement, correctional facilities and dispatch services, fire training and auditing and any other services that would assist said governmental agencies in the implementation of law enforcement services within each member county and remaining in compliance with state and federal regulations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties have approved these Amendments by a three-fourths vote of the agency member Board of Directors on this 18th day of August, 2017.

Approved and passed this 5th day of September, 2017.
